About ACT for Meningitis



ACT for Meningitis was set up in 2011 by Siobhan and Noel Carroll following the tragic loss of their daughter Aoibhe, aged just 4, to Meningitis. Losing Aoibhe changed their lives forever and they wanted to try and prevent another family going through that heart break. They felt there was an urgent need for more awareness around Meningitis and that support be made available to anyone affected by the disease, therefore, in July 2011 they set up ACT for Meningitis, with a Mission to raise awareness, to promote education and to provide support to those affected by meningitis in Ireland, and with a vision to see an Ireland where lives are no longer lost to meningitis, and through our support services no-one faces the meningitis journey alone.

A non-government funded small organisation of just four part-time staff, ACT are completely focused on making a big difference. In just 7 short years through self-fundraising ACT have become the only organisation to offer a vast range of free support services to anyone in Ireland affected by Meningitis, either through bereavement of living with the severe after affects of this lifechanging disease.



Support Services

Our support services are tailored to the needs of the individual /family to find the most appropriate and beneficial service for them. Meningitis has a wide range of severe side affects coupled with the trauma of the experience and in 1 in 10 cases it tragically results in bereavement. Our trained family support officer assesses where the charity will be most beneficial in providing support.



Our services include creative therapies-including play and art therapy which help children deal with the impact of the disease, free counselling services for families or individuals who have been affected by Meningitis, Cranial Sacral Therapy, physiotherapy ,psychologist assessment, telephone support, one to one support, and family support days.

Awareness & Education

ACT for Meningitis is committed to raising awareness of the signs and symptoms of Meningitis. To date, we have distributed over 250,000 awareness cards, 45,000 information brochures and have facilitated hundreds of talks and presentations to schools, community groups and the public across the country further supplying numerous facilities, such as universities, crèches, schools, pharmacies and many places of work, with these life-saving cards..



Our various annual national awareness campaigns such as our Student Awareness Campaign, the Winter Warning, our Back-to-School Campaign and ACTion Teds Crèche Campaign enable us to reach thousands of new people every year with awareness. We further continue our awareness raising activities through print, radio and social media campaigns further reaching millions with life saving awareness, and with the availability of our free downloadable ACT for Meningitis Awareness App.



Knowing the signs and symptoms of Meningitis can save a life. ACT for Meningitis will strive to ensure through our awareness and education we can reduce the impact of this disease.



Awareness 2018

We continued to grow our meningitis awareness raising activities throughout 2018. Rapid and early identification of meningitis has always been a priority for ACT for Meningitis and empowering to ask "Could it be meningitis?" through our awareness campaigns, we are working to reduce the impact of meningitis.



Training Programmes

The importance of highlighting meningitis awareness amongst health professionals is key as always. As outlined in our 3 year strategic plan,

the ACT for Meningitis Training Programme was launched in 2018.

Working closely with the Education Manager of HSE West Ambulance Service, the training schedule began with a presentation to the National Ambulance Service staff in Galway.



The programme continued with a training session delivered to over 100 representatives from the National Ambulance Service, Fire Service, Garda, Coast Guard, Galway Mountain Rescue and Civil Defence. Feedback from attendees and co-facilitators has been extremely positive and as we plan into 2019, we expect to grow this service at a national level.



National Awareness Campaigns

Our annual national awareness campaigns continued throughout the year with our back to school campaign, winter warning campaign, our ACTion Ted creche campaigns, Viral meningitis awareness week, our student campaign "Mind your friends" and our Health facility awareness campaign. During the year we have distributed over 100,000 pieces of literature across Ireland.

Our Healthcare facility campaign being extremely successful with our flyers now available in 1,250 GP surgeries

and health centers. This campaign incorporated the design, production and distribution of Meningitis awareness and support information material to Healthcare Centres & Hospitals nationally, resulting in an increase in public awareness of meningitis, signs & symptoms, prevention, life after meningitis, and the support services & help we can offer.

Just said I would share some anecdotel feedback with you... eve though we are have not yet completed the servicing of all stands on our network for this term yet, we have already had some calls requesting more Act for Meningitis as they were already flying from our display being taking by patients and also used by the GP. A sure sign of a good brochure.



Feedback from the distribution company was very positive with high request from doctors for extra refills



throughout the 12 months. We also experienced a 27% increase in number of members availing of our services for the first time in 2018.

Throughout the year, we also hosted various awareness stands facilitated numerous talks and presentations to community groups, workplaces, schools and colleges across the country, with all participants having a better understanding about meningitis.



Media Awareness Campaigns

Social Media

Our digital engagement continued to grow with total social media followers of over 23,000 across our three platforms.

Facebook continues to be our most powerful digital awareness tools with one particular post achieving an organic reach of almost 200,000 people in March 2018..



Our total social media reach (number of people having the opportunity to see ACT for Meningitis posts) is up year-on-year. Practical support continues to be provided to those reaching out with concerns or worries about meningitis via social media.



Other Media

Several radio interviews were giving including one occasion where we worked in collaboration with the National Mental Health Organisation, Helplink Support Services, to highlight the affect meningitis can have on your mental health. Interviews on the importance of being meningitis aware were also given throughout the year and in particular at times when meningitis cases peak in Ireland.



development, as well as presentations on specialist topics from invited expert guests. Global CoMO and members shared project updates and key learning points.



Whilst there Siobhan was filmed and a short video was produced, whereby she shared her own personal story and the work of ACT for Meningitis in Ireland. The video was used in awareness campaigns across Europe.



Global Awareness

In March, Siobhan attended the Confederation of Meningitis Organisations (CoMO) global conference in Singapore representing ACT. The **conference** included workshops to facilitate member



Continuing to give ACT a voice at a European level, we attended the Patient Innovation Summit 2018, where "Patient Empowerment: The Digital Perspective" was the theme. This summit included a link up with leaders in their specialist fields in various European hubs talking on the subject.




World Meningitis Day

The theme for **World Meningitis Day 2018 was** #AllMeningitisMatters.

We used this opportunity to further raise awareness of ALL strains of

meningitis by sharing patient stories and experiences through a wide range of platforms including social, print and radio media outlets. As public and media attention was very much attuned to meningitis around this time, we also used this day as an opportunity to further spread the word about **meningitis**, how to spot it and what causes it, as well as the importance of vaccines.

As 2018 draws to a close we look forward to launching our new and exciting campaigns for 2019 and continuing to raise meningitis awareness to everyone around the country.





Fundraising in 2018



A challenging year in fundraising, as with the continued absence of multi-annual state funding, ACT for Meningitis have largely depended on community fundraising and donations to fund our growing support and awareness services once again in 2018.



The expansion of our Community Care Programme to 20 Counties this year, with an increase of 23% in the number of families availing of these private services resulted in increased costs, which were met by the 22% rise in income through our own annual fundraising events.

The successful securing of lottery funding from the HSE allowed expansion of various Family Support Workshops to locations in Galway, Dublin and Portlaoise, while a grant from the Bon Secours Community Fund enabled the development and deliverance of a brand new workshop in Galway.



Corporate donations from various businesses in Ireland and fundraising events in aid of ACT, funded our annual National Awareness
Campaigns, which grew to include our brand new Healthcare Facility
Awareness Programme this year.





We have continued to establish new and grow existing relationships with many communities, businesses, committees and individuals across Ireland who have and will continue to fundraise and advocate on behalf of us.

We remain fully compliant with the Principals of Fundraising and continue to carry out best practice in all aspects of our fundraising.



Our community fundraising has seen an increase in income for many our own events and also an increase in the number of events in-aid-of ACT.



Highlights:

 ACTion Teds Pyjamas Party had 39 participating crèches, raising €6,500 and distributing over 4,000 awareness cards.



- Strictly ACT raising in excess of €52,000.
- Rise in numbers for Remembering Aoibhe 5k & Duathlon 2018 (Raising €11,000)





Various events were held in aid of ACT throughout 2018 and many exceeded the targets of the volunteer fundraisers and committees.

- ACT Winter Ball sold out with 430 tickets sold, and funds raised were 110% increase on last year (Over €20,000 profit raised).
- VHI Mini Marathon with ACT had a 130-strong team in 2018 raising over €15,000
- 10 weeks to 10k raised €4,800

Grants, Trusts & Large Gifts

Applications were made to nine CHOs for HSE lottery funding in 2018 of which three were successful in securing funding of €4,700 for Group Family Support Workshops in Galway, Dublin and Portlaoise (this totals to approx 2.5% of total income).

Philanthropic and corporate grants were awarded this year from Bon Secours (€5,000) to support a new workshop in Galway. Corporate donations from Pfizer Ireland €1,000



and GSK €800 were made to support ongoing costs of awareness campaigns. Successful application was also made to The Cork Street Fund (€1,316).



2019's fundraising calendar is already filling up and as we continue to gain the support of our communities, sponsors, funders and corporate partners, so too will we continue to grow our support services and awareness campaigns and continue to reach out to anyone in Ireland affected by Meningitis.

Support in 2018

2018 was a very busy year in Family Support, we have extended our supports to 20 counties in Ireland. We served 108 families in 2018 an increase of 25 families on the previous year.



Through our Community Care Programme, in 2018 ACT for Meningitis provided the following support services:

- Play Therapy
- Counselling
- Bio Energy Therapy
- Cranio Sacrial Therapy
- Educational Psychologist assessment

- An adapted Filial Therapy approach provided without the child needing to attend
- Parent coaching
- Both in-person and on phone access to family support worker for emotional and practical support.



Home Visits

Our home visits continued, allowing people to receive support in their own home and plan for additional supports in their area. Families who have availed of our Home Visit service have all reported that it helped to have the visit. Starting to engage with the charity by having someone to talk to about your experience can be the easiest way to begin to recognise the impacts that Meningitis has had on both the person and on the family. Together the family support worker and the families can identify which of our support groups for adults, teenagers and children will be of support. Home visits give people the chance to tell their stories in their own space, often as people are recovering the energy needed to go to an



office or a service is beyond what they have available and mean that often they do not avail of services. ACT for Meningitis aspires to ensure each person on their journey of recovery from Meningitis gets ample opportunities to avail of supports.

New Supports in 2018

We were able to support a workplace in preparing for the return of a bereaved colleague by visiting, meeting with them and giving practical and emotional support.



We have had a very active role in supporting an adult carer of a now adult survivor of meningitis, putting in place access to respite home help care and offering life skills training through our family support officer.

We also facilitated a child observation within his preschool setting and are providing support to the preschool in order to help the address his additional needs post meningitis, while offering him play therapy at the same time. We have received a lot of positive feedback over the year, not least of all a comment from a woman who survived meningitis just over a year ago that her husband told her it was the first time he had seen her smile since the meningitis after she begun in our support services. She said she had felt hope for the first time in a very long time.

Another father of a young adult who survived meningitis a year ago stated "We will be forever grateful, I feel like you have helped give her back to us" after their daughter began in our support services.

Group Support Workshops

The You, Your Thoughts, Your ACTions workshops ran in Dublin and Galway. A nine week course, designed for and delivered to adults who were coping with the after effects of Meningitis. The course was open to parents of children who had Meningitis, people who



had been bereaved by Meningitis and adult survivors of Meningitis.

The course explored stress and anxiety and the part it plays in our lives, while also giving the opportunity to practice how different mindfulness practices like mindful yoga, sitting meditation and body scanning help to reduce stress.

The Reconnecting after Meningitis workshops were offered in Galway, Portlaoise and Dublin. The aim of these workshops is to help overcome the trauma which the families have been through after Meningitis. In some families it may be a child or a parent who has experienced meningitis or a family who has been bereaved. In each case the family dynamics have changed and the workshop focuses on rebuilding the attachment and focusing on the positives within the family, to strengthen and empower families. These have been developed and facilitated by a Child Psychotherapist specifically for the families we support.

New Workshop in 2018



Dont Just Survive, Thrive workshops started this year. The purpose of these workshops is to train parents in the use of techniques which will enable them to help their children who have been affected by meningitis, to combat the side effects and reach optimal development. Using a mix of Sensory processing and modulating techniques, Filial Therapy, psycho-education, mindfulness, relationship based humanistic and integrative techniques, the training was designed and facilitated by a Child and Adolescent Psychotherapist, Play Therapist and Filial Therapist. We offered them in Dublin, Galway and Portlaoise.



Participant feedback was incredibly positive and participants asked could it be made into a series of workshops as they felt they had gotten benefit that they were eager to learn and explore more.

One mother stated "This has been the missing piece, I knew I was missing something I just didn't know what before now".



Parents were eager to resolve some of their own residual trauma and grief from their child's meningitis experience. Attending to this need has allowed parents to be able to let go of some of the hurt and anger they hold, meaning they could be more present and available for their children.

Parents reported feeling empowered to begin to implement the range of practical strategies, one mother stated "I feel I know her better after this, I'm looking forward to connecting with her again" about her daughter who had Meningitis aged 4.

Another father stated "You are describing her and our house to a T, understanding it all means I feel I can be more understanding and patient in it all"

The Me Too groups have been postponed after consultation with parents until parents completed the Dont Just Survive, Thrive workshops.

Family Days



Our summer family support day ran in August in Dublin zoo, we were able to extend an invitation via our Facebook page in order to include any new families who may have been interested in attending, from this we had one new family attend and made contact with two other families who were not able to attend but were interested in hearing more about our supports.



Elf Town kindly extended an invitation to our families to attend, which was gladly received and enjoyed by all who attended.

Our Christmas family day took place on 16th December and was well attended, starting with breakfast in the Athlone Springs Hotel before visiting Glendeer Pet Farm and Santa. We had arranged early entry to Glendeer Pet



far in order to avoid crowds and allow children who may have sensory processing difficulties attend without the overwhelm of sensory input of the usual experience.






Financial Report 2018

Income for 2018


2017 was an extremely successful year for ACT for Meningitis, with an income of €276,121.56 to date. This is due to an increase in support from corporate partnerships, grants trusts and community events as outlined in the fundraising section of this report.



Expenditure for 2018

The expenditure for 2017 to date is €205,024.99, with a rapid growth in all areas of the organisation throughout the year expenditure has increased .Our national awareness campaigns across the

country have grown from previous years, wide the addition of pharmaceutical training and corporate events/talks. The increase in corporate support allowed us to develop and print new awareness materials including new pocket size awareness cards, two new brochures – Anyone, Anyage, Anytime and Meningitis support services. While other expenditure went towards the increase in our family support services with the introduction of new workshops across the country

GENERAL INFORMATION

ACT FOR MENINGITIS COMPANY LIMITED BY GUARANTEE is a company limited by guarantee incorporated in the Republic of Ireland. The registered office of the company is Unit 7, Royal Rock, Ballybane Industrial Estate, Galway which is also the principal place of business of the company. The nature of the company's operations and its principal activities are set out in the Directors' Report. The financial statements have been presented in Euro (©) which is also the functional currency of the company.

ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The following accounting policies have been applied consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the company's financial statements.

The financial statements of the company for the year ended 31 December 2018 have been prepared in accordance with the provisions of FRS 102 Section 1A (Small Entities) and the Companies Act 2014.

Basis of preparation

The financial statements have been prepared on the going concern basis and in accordance with the historical cost convention except for certain properties and financial instruments that are measured at revalued amounts or fair values, as explained in the accounting policies below. Historical cost is generally based on the fair value of the consideration given in exchange for assets. The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is the Companies Act 2014 and FRS 102 "The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland" Section 1A, issued by the Financial Reporting

Cash flow statement

The company has availed of the exemption in FRS 102 Section 1A from the requirement to prepare a Cash Flow Statement because it is classified as a small company.

Income is represented by the total funds raised from the activities of the charity during the year.

Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost or at valuation, less accumulated depreciation. The charge to depreciation is calculated to write off the original cost or valuation of tangible fixed assets, less their estimated residual value, over their expected useful lives as follows:

Fixtures, fittings and equipment

12.5% Straight Line

The carrying values of tangible fixed assets are reviewed annually for impairment in periods if events or changes in circumstances indicate the carrying value may not be recoverable.

Trade and other creditors are initially recognised at fair value and thereafter stated at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method, unless the effect of discounting would be immaterial, in which case they are stated at cost.

Current tax represents the amount expected to be paid or recovered in respect of taxable income for the year and is calculated using the tax rates and laws that have been enacted or substantially enacted at the Balance

Foreign currencies

Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated at the rates of exchange ruling at the Balance Sheet date. Non-monetary items that are measured in terms of historical cost in a foreign currency are translated at the rates of exchange ruling at the date of the transaction. Non-monetary items that are measured at fair value in a foreign currency are translated using the exchange rates at the date when the fair value was determined. The resulting exchange differences are dealt with in the Income and Expenditure Account.
